3. Fit 2 Live presenting Mayor Smith with a new Bicycle Friendly Community sign. The City's status as a bronze-level Bicycle Friendly Community (BFC) was just renewed. The designation is good until 2017. NLR has been a bronze-level BFC since 2009.
4. Recognition of attendees of the NLR Neighborhood Association leadership council leadership classes for 2013.
5. A presentation on the Service Line Warranties program by Oscar Arras of Utility Service Partners, Inc.

Mayor Smith asked Professor David Sink and Mr. Joe Busby to come forward. The city formed a Leadership Council including leaders from Neighborhood Associations. Mr. Dan Scott and Mrs. Shirley Abel put a program together which has been very successful. Professor Sink is a retired Professor from the University of Arkansas at Little Rock. Mr. Busby has been a Neighborhood

Association President in Little Rock for many years. Over the past few weeks, they have met with North Little Rock Neighborhood Association leaders. Professor Sink commended Mr. Scott and Mrs. Abel for their efforts. Mayor Smith joined them at the podium and presented certificates to Paula Lively – Amboy Neighborhood Association, John Pflasterer, Terri Imus and Charlie Hart – Argenta Neighborhood Association, Harlan Hunter – Baring Cross Neighborhood Association, Belinda Burney – Dark Hollow Community Development Corporation, Josh Crockett and Michael Hansberry – Cypress Crossing Property Owners Association, Evelyn Creal – Meadow Park Neighborhood Association, Margo Tenner – Melrose Community Outreach, Karen Alford – Military Heights Outreach Association, Ken Abel – North Little Rock Police Athletic League, Stephanie Minyard and John Gregan – Park Hill Neighborhood Association, Dennis Fisk – Rose City Neighborhood Association and Alice Kunce – Scenic Hill Neighborhood Association.

Mayor Smith asked Chief of Staff Danny Bradley to come forward and review proposed changes to yard waste/bulky items collection in the city. Mr. Bradley said Mayor Smith asked him to review the Sanitation Department and see if there were efficiencies and/or cost savings to be gained. The main change would be the separation of green waste (brush, leaves, grass clippings) from junk or rubbish. The proposed ordinance would restrict when rubbish (or junk) could be put at the curb (from anytime) to the day before scheduled pickup. Alderman Hight asked about yard trimmings, leaves, grass, etc. being referenced under both rubbish or trash and green waste. Alderman Foutch asked if the city paid American Composting by the load. Mr. Harold Ford, Sanitation Director reviewed a memorandum provided to council members regarding the proposal. A total of \$1,244,375.65 was paid to American Composting, Inc, City of Little Rock Landfill, and Two Pine Landfill in 2012. Mr. Ford referred the Fee Schedule included in the memorandum which compared 2012 rates to 2013 rates. If green waste were processed separately and based on 44,098.6 cubic yards, savings would have been \$94,371.00. If rubbish/junk were processed separately, savings would have been \$271,899.00. The total savings would have been \$366,270.00 in 2012. Alderwoman Ross asked if new equipment would be required. Mr. Ford said the city is scheduled to get new trucks next year under a five year purchase plan. A boom truck only requires one employee (driver/operator) where a trash truck has three employees. Alderwoman Ross asked who would enforce violations. Mr. Ford said educating the public would be required. Mr. Bradley said there would not be a fine. However, a collection fee (\$50.00) would be assessed to those who do not separate green waste from junk (or rubbish). Sanitation supervisors would monitor violations or issues. Mr. Bradley said green waste can be put out anytime.

Mayor Smith asked Mr. Bradley to review proposed changes regarding barricades and street cuts, etc. Mr. Bradley said street cuts and repairs need to be repaired and maintained better. The proposed ordinance would include standards for street cuts and/or repairs. The fee schedule for permit fees has also been reviewed and revised. A fee will also be included for barricades. Projected revenue in 2014 is \$230,000.00. Mayor Smith said local utility providers are aware of the proposed change. Alderwoman Ross referenced poorly repaired street cuts in the city.

Mayor Smith invited Mrs. Bernadette Rhodes to come forward. Mrs. Rhodes said North Little Rock has been re-awarded a Bronze Level Bicycle Friendly Community Award and presented a sign to Mayor Smith. North Little Rock was the first city in the state to receive the recognition in 2009. More trails have been added and existing trails have been expanded since then, including the Emerald Park Trail and Levy Trail. Fit 2 Live is selling Bicycle Jerseys for \$50.00.

Mayor Smith invited Mr. Oscar Arras with Utility Service Partners, Inc. to come forward. Mr. Arras said there are 180 communities across the nation participating in the National League of Cities Service Line Warranty Program. Cities of all sizes participate in the program. The program went into effect in North Little Rock in May 2012. Since then, 1,217 residents have enrolled in the sewer program and filed 125 claims. 824 residents have enrolled in the water line program and filed 31 claims. Mr. Arras referenced survey results which overall were very good or excellent. Mayor Smith thanked Mr. Arras for his presentation.

Presentations concluded at 6:35 p.m.

The regular meeting of the North Little Rock City Council scheduled for Monday, October 28, 2013, was called to order at 6:38 p.m. by the honorable Mayor JOE A. SMITH. The roll having been called and the following Aldermen answered to their names: DEBI ROSS, BETH WHITE, MAURICE TAYLOR, LINDA ROBINSON, STEVE BAXTER, BRUCE FOUTCH, CHARLIE HIGHT and MURRY WITCHER (8/0). A quorum was declared. Assistant City Clerk Linda Marshall and Assistant City Attorney Matt Fleming were also present.

Mayor Smith invited Elder Thaddeus Rogers to come forward to lead the invocation, followed by the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

On the motion of Alderman Witcher and seconded by Alderman Hight and by consent of all members present, the minutes of a regular council meeting held on Monday, October 14, 2013, and a Special Call Meeting held on Thursday, October 17, 2013, were approved, accepted and filed as prepared by the City Clerk (8/0).

Mayor Smith convened a public hearing regarding R-13-198 and advised no city funds are involved in this project. It is an exchange of an undevelopable property for one that is developable. The Quarry will become (part of Burns Park) a park. The other property will be available for private development. The city is not building a lodge. Mrs. Connie Phillips chaired the North Little Rock Public Land Task Force. Primarily, the Task Force looked at the Quarry property and considered resident concerns pertaining to Commercial Development. Consideration was given to park land, green space, economic development or land that could be sold. A lot of sporting events are held in Burns Park each year. There is also a need for lodging and conference meeting room space. The location near the interstate would be minimally invasive to the park. Mr. Kevin Newsome also served on the Land Task Force.

He reiterated Mrs. Phillips comments regarding the Quarry property and park area. There being no one else wishing to be heard, Mayor Smith adjourned the public hearing. Alderman Witcher asked about events held in Burns Park over the past weekend. Mr. Bob Rhoads, Parks and Recreation Director said a Soccer Tournament had 1,500 – 2,000 youth participants, plus parents and grandparents (1,000) in attendance. A Sectional Tennis Tournament was also held with 50 teams (with 8 – 10 members each).

On the blanket motion of Alderman Baxter and seconded by Alderwoman Robinson, and by consent of all members present, communications #1, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7, were accepted and filed (8/0).

PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. James Ard said there is not a phone number on (city) Electric bills for CenterPoint Energy. The back of the bill has Reliant listed. If you try to pay at the city drive-thru, they won't take a payment made out to Reliant. Mr. Ard said he complained to his aldermen about a sign in another area of the city. He should be able to complain about it even if he doesn't live in the area. Alderwoman Robinson thanked Code Enforcement, Police and other city departments for their efforts to clean up East Broadway which looks much better than it did 10 years ago. She also commended Code and Police for their efforts on Gribble. Alderwoman Robinson referenced the petition (communication #2) presented by the Dixie Addition. There are problems with skunks in the area. Mayor Smith said the property is owned by Union Pacific Railroad. He will again ask them to clean up the area. Monday, November 11, 2013, at 2:00 p.m., a Veteran's Day Ceremony will be held in Laman Plaza. The Keynote Speaker will be former City Attorney and Arkansas Guard Member Paul Suskie. The Military Band from Camp Robinson will also perform. Mayor Smith reminded everyone that city offices will be closed on Monday, November 11, however, the City Council meeting scheduled for that night will be held as scheduled. Mayor Smith said Friday, November 1, 2013, the last football game will be played in the existing Wildcat Stadium.
