The invocation and pledge of allegiance were led by Alderwoman Robinson.

A motion to approve the minutes from September 8, 2014, North Little Rock City Council meeting and Special Call meeting was made by Alderman Witcher and seconded by Alderman Foutch. A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND CITY CLERK TO ENTER INTO AN EASEMENT AGREEMENT WITH FLOYD FULKERSON AND BRENDA FULKERSON TO ALLOW EXTENSION OF ELECTRIC SERVICE FOR THE MARION BERRY PUMP STATION OWNED BY BAYOU METO WATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICT; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, was read (above). A motion to adopt was made by Alderman Witcher and seconded by Alderwoman Ross. Mr. C. Jason Carter, Interim General Manager North Little Rock Electric Department (and City Attorney) advised the city council authorized imminent domain proceedings at the previous council meeting. Mr. Carter has since negotiated with Mr. and Mrs. Fulkerson. He referenced a paragraph in the agreement regarding relocating lines. Alderman Foutch asked the estimated cost of moving the lines. Mr. Carter did not have that at this time. The work would be done by North Little Rock Electric and use materials already there. Alderman Witcher asked about the voltage on the lines. Mr. Carter said the upper voltage is 69 and the lower line voltage is 13.8 distribution level. On the motion of Alderman Witcher and seconded by Alderwoman Ross, and by consent of all members present, the resolution was amended as follows:: attache Exhibits "C" and "D"

provided this date (8/0). On the motion of Alderman Foutch and seconded by Alderman Taylor, and by consent of all members present, the resolution was unanimously adopted as amended (8/0).

Mayor Smith invited Mrs. Karen Scott, Finance Director to come forward. Mrs. Scott said the city has been working on a web-based tool for North Little Rock Utility Customers to utilize to look up their accounts and pay bills. (Customer Connect) will be branded "My Account". Ms. Jill Ponder, North Little Rock Electric Department said the Electric Department and Utility Accounting Departments have worked together to streamline the way services are provided. Customers will be able to review usage, make payments, etc. Council members and department heads were asked to test the product during the next month and provide feedback. Ms. Ponder then provided a PowerPoint Presentation regarding use of the service. This program should be available to the public early in November. Customers on levelized billing or bank draft will see no change. Alderman Taylor asked if there was a fee to pay online. Ms. Ponder said there was (\$3.25). Mayor Smith said none of online convenience fee goes to the city.

Mayor Smith invited Mrs. Bernadette Rhoads, Fit 2 Live Coordinator to come forward. Mrs. Rhoads introduced Arkansas GardenCorps members, Beau Cooper and Sharice Loftin. Mr. Cooper and Ms. Loftin presented and narrated a PowerPoint Presentation which illustrated the value and status of North Little Rock's Community Gardens. Arkansas ranks #1 in low food security which is defined as adults and children who skip meals on a regular basis due to lack of food. Community gardens help address hunger issues. Multiple examples of community garden projects were provided. Learning to grow and prepare food is important too. Cooking Matters is a program where youth are taught these skills and more. There are 18 community gardens in the city at this time. Mayor Smith said North Little Rock has one of the premier garden programs in the United States.

Mayor Smith asked Fire Marshal John Pflasterer to come forward. Captain Pflasterer advised fire hydrant testing will be conducted during the month of October. The increased flow of water can result in discolored water. However, it is still safe to drink. He advised against washing clothes in discolored water as it could stain them. A flyer was recently mailed with water bills. Alderman Taylor said the hydrant at the intersection of Poplar and 4th was leaking.

Mayor Smith announced citizen public comment on agenda items. Mr. Garland Ferguson spoke for his sister Elinor Ferguson who was unable to attend due to health reasons. Ms. Ferguson made a bid of \$21,250.00 for property referenced in R-14-168 on River Road. This property was part of the family's old home place. This is the first chance the family has had to try and buy back the property. They do not plan to develop the property and want to maintain the tranquil state of the area. They would not be opposed to future development. Mayor Smith said he would not call the legislation this date and advised Alderwoman Robinson wanted to be removed as a cosponsor. Mayor Smith said the proposal of the developer was to pay to extend the sewer line under Rockwater Boulevard. Mr. Wayne Burke lives on River Road. He learned of the proposed sell of the property 10 weeks ago. He called the

Mayor's Office and spoke with (Chief of Staff) Danny Bradley. Mr. Burke said he was not opposed to development. The city has made some good decisions and some bad ones. Mr. Burke was told the proposed development would be a two-story, high quality, brick office building. He learned on September 10, 2014, that the property was going to be rezoned and sold. He then met Alderman Taylor at the site. He, his brother and other property owners met with Mr. Bradley again on September 11, 2014. Mr. Robert Voyles (Planning Department) and (inaudible) Eason were also present. Mr. Eason provided an illustration of a one-story prefabricated metal building. Mr. Burke said he was told the property was for sale for \$17,000.00 which was more than the city paid for it (\$16,500.00). Mr. Burke said Mr. Eason told him lots at Riverview and Rockwater were selling for \$160,000.00 each. This property has a river view and river frontage. Mr. Burke asked the council to vote against the legislation. Mrs. Stephanie Burke agreed with the previous comments of her husband (Wayne Burke). The adjacent property they own will be inherited by their children and grandchildren and it is their duty to keep their interests in mind. They have taken care of their property and the property next to it. The proposed development will hurt the value of their property. Mr. Steve Morley spoke for O-14-90. His client Diane Holitik owns Pat's Beverage Shop. They are asking for approval of this ordinance to be able to install an electronic changeable copy sign. Mr. Gene Pfeifer spoke for O-14-87. The applicant bought a piece of property on Young Road when it was a blighted area. A lot of improvements have been made in the area.

Mayor Smith then called R-14-168 and held the legislation.

O-14-90 (ORDINANCE NO. 8681 - ALDERMEN WITCHER AND HIGHT) AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 7697 ("THE ZONING ORDINANCE") TO ESTABLISH NORTH HILLS II SIGN OVERLAY DISTRICT; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, was read. Without objection, Alderman Hight was added as a cosponsor. On the motion of Alderman Witcher and seconded by Alderman Hight, and by consent of all members present, the rules were suspended and the ordinance was placed on its second reading (8/0). On the motion of Alderman Witcher and seconded by Alderman Hight, and by consent of all members present, the rules were again suspended and the ordinance was placed on its third and final reading (8/0). A motion to adopt was made by Alderman Witcher and seconded by Alderman Hight. Alderwoman Ross said the sign can be no bigger than a six foot (6') monument sign. Alderman Witcher said future legislation will be proposed to change that. Alderman Witcher said there is a (pole) sign at the location. The sign installer (name not provided) said the sign (Pat's Beverage Shop) will go into an existing space. It will be upgraded to an Electronic sign which will be "neighborhood friendly." Features include a photocell and still images. Alderman Foutch asked what made this sign different from one requested previously by Wild River Country which was denied by the council. The sign installer said there are new features on the signs that weren't available a year ago. Alderman Baxter said this legislation will create the Sign Overlay District only and does not deal with the sign itself. Alderwoman Ross asked if the intent of the Overlay District was to allow the sign previously

mentioned. On the previous motion, and the roll having been called, and all members present having voted in the affirmative, with the exception of Alderwomen Ross and White who voted no, the ordinance was adopted (6/2). On the emergency clause all members voted in the affirmative, with the exception of Alderwoman Ross, who voted no. Emergency clause adopted (7/1). (*requested by Diane Holitik - Pat's Beverage Shop/Steve Morley*)

O-14-91 (ORDINANCE NO. 8682 - ALDERMAN WITCHER) AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A SPECIAL USE TO ALLOW A COMMUNITY CENTER FOR YOUTH IN AN R-2 ZONE FOR CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY LOCATED AT 5301 SUMMERTREE DRIVE - #B IN THE CITY OF NORTH LITTLE ROCK, ARKANSAS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, was read. On the motion of Alderman Witcher and seconded by Alderman Hight, and by consent of all members present, the rules were suspended and the ordinance was placed on its second reading (8/0). On the motion of Alderman Witcher and seconded by Alderman Hight, and by consent of all members present, the rules were again suspended and the ordinance was placed on its third and final reading (8/0). A motion to adopt was made by Alderman Witcher and seconded by Alderman Taylor. Alderwoman Ross asked if the applicant was present. She was not. Alderman Witcher said this is connected with a church. Alderwoman Ross wanted to be sure the applicant understood the days and hours of operation (Monday - Friday, 3:00 p.m. - 6:00 p.m.) stipulated in the ordinance and asked who would enforce those dates and times. Alderwoman Ross said there had been complaints from this location in the past, however, none were recent. Mayor Smith asked Mr. Voyles to be sure the applicant understands the rules. Alderman Foutch was at the Planning Commission meeting and there were concerns from neighbors, including noise issues. On the previous motion, and the roll having been called, and all members present having voted in the affirmative, the ordinance was unanimously adopted (8/0). Emergency clause unanimously adopted (8/0). (applicant: Debora Washington)

PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. James Ard thanked Alderwoman White for getting the handicapped spot changed so vans would fit. Mr. Ard said people are putting campaign signs in yards without permission. He said Aldermen should abide by the rules. Mayor Smith said he asked Code Enforcement to pick up any signs in the right-of-way. Candidates can retrieve them from Code Enforcement. Mr. Pfeifer said Conquer the Gauntlet was held last Saturday at Burns Park. 1,800 people participated in a Marine Corp style obstacle course. Alderwoman White asked if an event like this could be held for senior adults. Alderman Hight said he was riding his bike in the area and it looked like the participants were having a lot of fun. Alderwoman Ross provided and update from Brian Temple with Waste Management regarding a reports on tagged recycling bins. Currently, they do not have a report. They will step up their efforts and are prepared to place an additional employee in their trucks to tag carts that contain contaminants. Alderwoman White said a Zumba-thon fundraiser will be held at all 10 Fitness locations on October 3, 2014. National Night Out will be Tuesday, October 7, 2014. Alderman Foutch reminded the public to review their telephone and credit card statements. One of his credit card

numbers was recently used by someone who charged their car insurance, cable TV and cell phone payments along with other charges totaling several thousand dollars. Alderman Hight said people are in the neighborhoods painting curbs and asked if there were any that were licensed in the city at this time. Ms. Whitbey knew of one and encouraged the public to contact the City Clerk's Office to verify business licenses. Ms. Whitbey advised Fire Fest will be Tuesday, October 7, 2014, in the Kroger parking lot off McCain Boulevard. Alderwoman Ross said Dark Hollow Day is Saturday, September 27, 2014.

There being no further business to come before the Council, and on the motion of Alderman Hight and seconded by Alderman Witcher, and by consent of all members present, the meeting was adjourned at 7:25 p.m. (8/0), until the next regularly scheduled meeting which will be held on Monday, October 13, 2014, at six o'clock p.m. in the City Council Chambers in City Hall, located at 300 Main Street, North Little Rock, Arkansas.
