The regular meeting of the North Little Rock City Council scheduled for Monday, November 28, 2016, was called to order at 6:01 p.m. by the Honorable Mayor Joe A. Smith

The roll having been called and the following Aldermen answered to their names: DEBI ROSS, BETH WHITE, LINDA ROBINSON, STEVE BAXTER, BRUCE FOUTCH, and MURRY WITCHER (6/0). Aldermen MAURICE TAYLOR and CHARLIE HIGHT were absent. City Clerk Diane Whitbey and City Attorney C. Jason Carter were also present.

The prayer and pledge of allegiance were led by Alderman Baxter.

On the motion of Alderman Witcher and seconded by Alderwoman Ross, and by consent of all members present, the minutes from the North Little Rock City Council meeting held on Monday, November 14, 2016, were approved, accepted and filed as prepared by the City Clerk (6/0).

Mr. Carter advised the legislation was (called and) heard at the previous City Council meeting. Mayor Smith convened a public hearing. Mr. Carter said a Multi-Purpose Improvement District can encompass a variety of things defined by (state) statute. There being no one present wishing to be heard, the public hearing was adjourned at 6:15 p.m. Mr. Carter will file legislation to ratify this action at the next council meeting.

A motion to adopt was made by Alderwoman Robinson and seconded by Alderman Taylor. Mayor Smith convened a public hearing. Mr. David Gober lives adjacent to the property and is one of the heirs. He would like to purchase the property and asked what he needs to do. Mayor Smith said the City doesn't own the property. Mr. Gober said he is trying to catch up the tax (payments). Mr. Carter said someone will have to pay the lien which represents city funds that were spent on the property. Alderman Foutch asked if the lien would be included in the taxes owed on the property. Mr. Gober wanted to know if he had to come up with the full amount or make payments. Mayor Smith recommended he talk to his attorney. Mr. Gober said the previous owners are deceased and did not have children and that Emmet Gober was his uncle. On the previous motion, and by consent of all members present, the resolution was adopted (7/0). (*amount - \$3,006.54*)

R-16-190 (RESOLUTION NO. 9102 – MAYOR SMITH)

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ENERGY COST RECOVERY (ECR) RIDER; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, was read. On the motion of Alderman Baxter and seconded by Alderwoman Ross, and by consent of all members present, the rules were suspended and the ordinance was placed on its second reading (7/0). On the motion of Alderman Baxter and seconded by Alderman Foutch, and by consent of all members present, the rules were again suspended and the ordinance was placed on its third and final reading (7/0). The ordinance was read a third and final time. Mr. Carter said when the ECR was established, it was a variable component within (electric) rates. It was to fluctuate up and down based on the cost of power. Originally, all costs were rolled into one bill. Now costs are broken down. Power costs have gone down, however, transmission costs have increased. This ordinance looks at all costs related to delivery of an electron to the city's distribution system. On the motion of Alderman Baxter and seconded by Alderman Foutch, and the roll having been called, and all members present having voted in the affirmative, the ordinance was adopted (7/0). Emergency clause adopted (7/0).

O-16-82 (ORDINANCE NO. 8861 – ALDERMAN BAXTER)

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A SPECIAL USE TO ALLOW INDOOR RETAIL IN AN I-2 ZONE FOR CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY LOCATED AT 10503 MAUMELLE BOULEVARD – BLDG. Emergency clause adopted (7/0). (*applicant: North Little Rock School District*)

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A REQUEST TO WAIVE REQUIREMENTS OF THE MASTER STREET PLAN FOR HALF STREET IMPROVEMENTS FOR CERTAIN PROPERTY LOCATED ALONG REMOUNT ROAD IN THE CITY OF NORTH LITTLE ROCK, ARKANSAS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, was read. On the motion of Alderman Witcher and seconded by Alderman Baxter, and by consent of all members present, the readings were suspended (7/0). A motion to adopt was made by Alderman Witcher and seconded by Alderman Foutch. Alderman Taylor said he drove by the area and asked why the street improvements were being waived. Alderman Witcher said there aren't any improvements in the area now. Mayor Smith agreed, there were no sidewalks, curbs, or gutters. Alderman Witcher said hopefully, the development of this property will help with runoff in the area. Jason with Marlar Engineering said this is for a replat of the property. Alderman Taylor asked what was on the back side of the lot. Mayor Smith said it is a (private) baseball field. On the previous motion, and the roll having been called, and all members present, having voted in the affirmative, the ordinance was adopted (7/0). Emergency clause adopted (7/0). (*applicant: Marlar Engineering*)

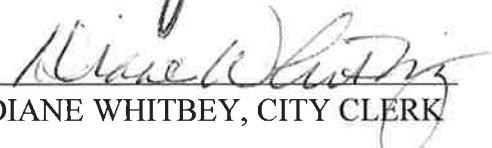
PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. James Ard said Alderman Foutch has done a great job (serving on the city council). He also thanked Alderman Foutch's wife (Jan). Mr. Ard congratulated Mr. Ron Harris, Alderman-elect for Ward 3. Mr. Ard also congratulated Mr. Carlton Wing on his win. Alderwoman White said the annual North Little Rock Christmas Parade will be this Sunday (December 4, 2016). Mayor Smith said it will start at 3:00 p.m., which is a later time due to an event scheduled at Verizon Arena. He encouraged participants to attend the Northern Lights Festival and Christmas Tree Lighting (at the City Services Building, 120 Main Street), following the parade. Alderman Witcher said December 7, 2016, a Pearl Harbor Day Event will be held at 11:30 a.m. (at the USS Razorback Submarine). Mayor Smith said this year will mark the 75th Anniversary of the bombing at Pearl Harbor. Ms. Whitbey announced the North Little Rock Heritage Center will open an exhibit (North Little Rock Railroads: Building a City) on Sunday, December 4, 2016 at 2:00 p.m. and encouraged people to stop by and watch the parade from the Heritage Center. Alderman Baxter recently spent time with North Little Rock Electric Department General Manager James Bray and learned more about power poles, power distribution, etc.

It was very educational and informative. Mayor Smith reminded everyone the second City Council meeting in December will be held on Tuesday, December 27, 2016. The Swearing In Ceremony (for North Little Rock Elected Officials) will be Sunday, January 1, 2017, at 1:00 p.m. in the lobby of City Hall. Everyone is invited. Elected officials were reminded to provide their invitation lists to his office by the end of the week. Alderman Baxter said the North Little Rock Charging Wildcats Football Team will play Fayetteville at War Memorial Stadium. Mayor Smith encouraged everyone to attend the game and show support for North Little Rock.

There being no further business to come before the Council, and on the motion of Alderwoman Ross and seconded by Alderman Baxter, and by consent of all members present, the meeting was adjourned at 6:45 p.m. (7/0), until the next regularly scheduled meeting which will be held on Monday, December 12, 2016, at six o'clock p.m. in the City Council Chambers in City Hall, located at 300 Main Street, North Little Rock, Arkansas.
