The regular meeting of the North Little Rock City Council scheduled for Monday, May 14, 2018, was called to order at 6:03 p.m. by the Honorable Mayor Joe A. Smith.

The roll having been called and the following Council Members answered to their names: DEBI ROSS, BETH WHITE, LINDA ROBINSON, STEVE BAXTER, RON HARRIS, CHARLIE HIGHT, and MURRY WITCHER (7/0). Council Member MAURICE TAYLOR was absent. City Clerk Diane Whitbey, Deputy City Clerk/Revenue Enforcement Officer Shannon Carroll and City Attorney Amy Fields were also present.

The prayer and pledge of allegiance were led by City Attorney Fields.

On the motion of Council Member Witcher and seconded by Council Member Hight and by consent of all members present, the minutes from the North Little Rock City Council meeting held on Monday, April 23, 2018, were approved, accepted and filed as prepared by the City Clerk (7/0).

On the motion of Council Member Baxter and seconded by Council Member Harris, and by consent of all members present, communications #1, 2, and 4,were not read, but were accepted and filed (7/0).

On the motion of Council Member Baxter and seconded by Council Member Ross, and by consent of all members present, communication #5 was read, accepted and filed (7/0).

Council Member Baxter said this is a drop by type meeting and encouraged the public to attend and ask questions. Council Member Ross said the plans include changing the direction of some streets.

On the motion of Council Member Witcher and seconded by Council Member Hight, and by consent of all members present, communication #6, was read, accepted and filed (7/0).

Both teams won the State Championship this year. Mayor Smith visited with the team members before the council meeting and presented each member with a proclamation. Team coaches then introduced the members and photos were taken with Mayor Smith.

Mayor Smith reconvened a public hearing regarding O-18-26 – establishing Electric Rates for the North Little Rock Electric Department at 6:17 p.m. Ms. Jennifer Johansen lives in Levy and is a North Little Rock Electric Department Customer. She supports the restructuring plan. The department has looked ahead and planned for its future needs. Pastor Daryl Dandredge is the pastor at New Creation Bible Church on Percy Machin, in the Military Heights area. He understands the need. Inflation and the cost of living increase, while income remains the same. A lot of people in the city are on a fixed income. Pastor Dandredge said notification of (these) hearings could have been included with electric bills. The church is trying to help residents in the community. If this change passes, more help will be needed. Mr. Henry Fisbeck lives in Ward 3. He is opposed to this legislation. The one-cent sales tax was supposed to take care of the city's needs. The increase will be hard on low and fixed income users. It will also cause businesses and residents to leave the city. His property value has decreased by 50% during the past 10 years. The city needs to be more efficient. Mrs. Phyllis Hodges met with several council members following the previous meeting and thanked them for their time. She said after talking with them, she realized the importance of the upgrades. Mrs. Hodges said people need more time to work on their (business) finances and/or acquire more customers. Other business owners and pastors feel the same way. Mr. James Ard is not opposed to higher rates. He is on a fixed income and it is hard to come up with more money. North Little Rock hasn't had an Electric rate increase in 10 years. Maintenance is important. The city has 14 Switching Stations. One is under construction.

Eight of the stations are over 45 years old. The Electric Department performs general maintenance. However, lightening and squirrels can take out equipment. Mr. Kristian Nelson said the United States produces more energy than any other country. There are alternative ways to provide energy that might save money. Mr. Nelson works at Hawgs Blues Café. It is a daily battle to keep the lights on, meet payroll and pay taxes. Running a business is hard. He has 15 to 20 employees who work 40 hours a week. Many of them are convicted felons. If they go out of business, it will affect the employees. Mr. Nelson said he supported the one-cent sales tax increase. He asked Council Members to consider another alternative. There being no one else wishing to be heard, the public hearing was adjourned at 6:34 p.m.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING ELECTRIC RATES FOR NORTH LITTLE ROCK ELECTRIC DEPARTMENT CUSTOMERS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, was read one time April 9, 2018. It was read a second time April 23, 2018. Public hearings were held April 9, 2019, and April 23, 2018. A public hearing was reconvened this date (see above), and adjourned (see above). The ordinance was read a third and final time. A motion to adopt was made by Council Member Witcher and seconded by Council Member Hight. On the motion of Council Member Ross and seconded by Council Member Witcher, and by consent of all members present, the ordinance was amended as follows:: Section 4: strike through 2019 and insert 2020 (7/0). A motion to adopt as amended was made by Council Member Witcher and seconded by Council Member Hight. Council Member Ross said the Electric Department has a separate budget. Neither the one-cent sales tax nor city budget funds the Electric Department. Mayor Smith said the Electric Department is a company that the city owns. Decisions have to be made for the company the same as Entergy or Southwest Electric Co-op. The City Council is the Board of Directors for the company. Council Member Ross owned a business. (An additional) \$40.00 a month is a lot for anyone. However, when she owned a business, if suppliers raised their prices, she had to raise hers. On the previous motion, and the roll having been called, and all members present having voted in the affirmative, with the exception of Council Member Robinson, who voted no, the ordinance was adopted as amended (6/1). On the emergency clause, all members present voted in the affirmative with the exception of Council Member Robinson, who voted no, emergency clause adopted (6/1).

Mayor Smith then convened public comment on remaining legislation and advised regarding O-18-30 – an ordinance reclassifying property East of Graham Avenue and North of Page Mill Road, the item will be held. Mr. Steven Briggs said they have a lot of mosquitos in the neighborhood. Everyone in the neighborhood is against the proposal to remove and sell the dirt to make the property into farmland. Pastor Earl Graham is the Senior Pastor of Mt. Pleasant Baptist Church which is located off of Page Mill Road. His interest is for his parishioners. There are concerns about the church property, access and the parking lot. Mr. Paul Smith is a life-long member of Mt. Pleasant Baptist Church. The church relocated from Willow Street to their current location in February, 2017. They have not received any

notification regarding the proposed project. Mr. Smith took some photographs which he distributed to council members. Mayor Smith said he spoke with the applicant who advised the church was supportive of the proposal and that he (the applicant) was cleaning out the property. Mr. Smith said the church Board of Trustees and Directors have not received any written notice as to what is taking place or the purpose. Mr. Smith said there are concerns about using the streets for heavy equipment to transport the dirt. He also said there were concerns with accessing the property through the church's easements or parking lot. Mr. Smith asked who would monitor the mining and how long the project would last. He also asked who would be responsible for repairs or damages caused by the mining. Mr. Smith asked if there would be flooding issues and referenced a lake behind the church. Finally, he asked if there was a bond in place and if any additional insurance would be required. Council Member Robinson said she spoke with a representative of the Gas Pipeline Company and was advised there are two gas pipelines on the property. One has been there since 1940. The other was added in 1970. If the pipeline were to burst, it could release 1,000 pounds of gas. Council Member Robinson said UPS (Arkansas One Call) needed to go out and determine where the lines are located. She also spoke with someone at Texas Eastern and was advised the same regarding the pipelines.

The 600 Main Building will begin about 60 days after other construction. If work can begin in June (2018), the completion date may be late summer to early fall of 2019. Council Member Hight asked the amount of the reductions. Mayor Smith estimated \$200,000.00 to \$300,000.00. PUBLIC COMMENT

Mayor Smith said new (emergency warning) sirens have been installed. Beginning Wednesday, May 30, 2018, a new 45 second siren will be tested. This information will also be on the city's website. Mr. Nathan Hamilton, Communication Director said the new sirens are digital and multi-directional. Mayor Smith distributed copies of North Little Rock Proud, a new magazine that will be mailed to residents and businesses in the city. If this is well-received, it will become a quarterly magazine. Mayor Smith said the next council meeting is scheduled for Monday, May 28, 2018. With approval from the council, the meeting will be held on Tuesday, May 29, 2018. Council Member Baxter said there may be a graduation at Verizon Arena that night so parking could be an issue. Mr. James Ard thanked the council for their vote for the Electric rates. The Electric Department is a business and it takes a lot to keep it running. Mr. Ard said Mayor Smith has done away with over \$40 million in debt. Mayor Smith said the city paid off \$10 million in loans last year. Council Member Robinson said she appreciates the Street Department for picking up campaign signs that are placed in the right-of-way. This can be unsightly. Council Member Ross said there are signs in the area of the Veteran's Memorial attached to the fence. Ms. Whitbey said this was brought to the attention of the Library's Director. Council Member Witcher acknowledged Mr. James Bray, retired General Manager North Little Rock Electric Department. Mr Bray retired last week with 43 years of service to the city.

There being no further business to come before the Council, and on the motion of Council Member Ross and seconded by Council Member Robinson, and by consent of all members present, the meeting was adjourned at 7:23 p.m. (7/0), until the next regularly scheduled meeting to be held on *Tuesday*, *May 29, 2018*, at six o'clock p.m. in the City Council Chambers in City Hall, located at 300 Main Street, North Little Rock, Arkansas.
