Note: Council Members participated in the meeting electronically. Mayor Smith, City Clerk Whitbey and City Attorney Fields were present in the council chambers.

The prayer was led by Council Member Robinson.

On the motion of Council Member Baxter and seconded by Council Member Taylor, and by consent of all members present, communication #1 was accepted and filed (8/0).

There will be bright lights which will affect his quality of life. On the motion of Council Member Harris and seconded by Council Member Baxter, and by consent of all members present, the readings were suspended (8/0). A motion to adopt was made by Council Member Harris and seconded by Council Member Baxter. Council Member Ross said members were provided a copy of the site plan. She asked Mr. Spencer to comment on Mr. Martinez's statements. Mr. Spencer said the school did a lighting study which indicated the ambient lighting will not overflow onto Mr. Martinez's property. He also provided him with a copy of the study. Council Member White asked about trees that were discussed at the Planning Commission meeting. Mr. Spencer said there will be an undisturbed buffer to the north side of the property. Fast growing evergreen trees, which were selected by a landscape architect, will also be planted in the area provide additional buffer. Council Member Taylor asked about Mr. Martinez's comment regarding a sports complex. Mr. Spencer said a high school with a soccer field, track and practice field will be on the property. The buffer for this property will be more than that of the existing baseball fields (on adjacent property). On the previous motion, and the roll having been called, and all members present having voted in the affirmative, the ordinance was unanimously adopted (8/0). Emergency clause unanimously adopted (8/0). (applicant: Minton Engineering)

On the previous motion, and the roll having been called and all members present having voted in the affirmative, the ordinance was unanimously adopted (8/0). Emergency clause unanimously adopted (8/0). (applicant: Lighthouse Academies)

AN ORDINANCE ALLOWING A SPECIAL USE TO ALLOW AN AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM IN A C-4 ZONE FOR CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY LOCATED AT 4316 LANDERS ROAD IN THE CITY OF NORTH LITTLE ROCK, ARKANSAS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, was read. Without objection, Council Member Ginn was added as a cosponsor. On the motion of Council Member Hight and seconded by Council Member Taylor, and by consent of all members present, the readings were suspended (8/0). Council Member Hight asked Mr. Spencer to provide a brief explanation of the request. Mr. Spencer said the request is for an After School Program. The (State) Department of Human Services (DHS) is involved, therefore, a Special Use is required. It will not affect current operations. The location is in the gymnasium behind the church. On the motion of Council Member Hight and seconded by Council Member Ross, and the roll having been called, and all members present having voted in the affirmative, the ordinance was unanimously adopted (8/0). Emergency clause unanimously adopted (8/0). (applicant: Northside Sports Corporation). Ms. Whitbey asked if the business (Northside Sports Corporation) was part of the church for licensing purposes. Mr. Spencer advised it was not.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Ms. Whitbey read the following public comments: Ms. Pat Brewer asked why the Mayor has not been visible during the pandemic. There are a lot of senior citizens who do not have access to the Internet or other electronic media. Mayor Smith asked Ms. Brewer call him tomorrow (April 28, 2020).

Mr. Allen Coleman lives on Bradburn Road. He continues to have issues with parking in the cul-desac. Vehicles parked in the cul-de-sac are parked there all the time and do not have current (license) plates. Debris has collected under them. Mr. Coleman has talked to the Mayor, Council Members, Code Enforcement and North Little Rock Police Department regarding the issues. Council Member Taylor said there is an issue. Mayor Smith asked if he Council Member Taylor could meet him at the location so they can address the issues first hand. Other comments: Council Member White said she appreciated the Mayor's weekly (video) updates (regarding COVID-19) and the people he has included (interviewed). The messages have been informative and helpful. Council Member Baxter asked if the next meeting will be electronic (via Zoom). Council Member Ginn asked to (again) include the Pledge of Allegiance in future meetings.

Mayor Smith said the city is trying to locate N-95 masks as inventory is getting low. 3-M is beginning production. The city would like to order a total number that will cost around \$38,000.00. Therefore, he asked for a voice vote of the city council to waive competitive bidding for approval to order the masks. By consent of all members through a unanimous voice vote, the purchase was approved (8/0). Ms. Fields will provide legislation at the next scheduled council meeting. Mayor Smith said the majority of the masks will go to the Police Department.

There being no further business to come before the Council, and on the motion of Council Member Ross and seconded by Council Member Taylor, and by consent of all members present, the meeting was adjourned at 6:35 p.m. (8/0), until the next regularly scheduled meeting to be held on Monday, May 11, 2020, at six o'clock p.m. in the City Council Chambers in City Hall, located at 300 Main Street, North Little Rock, Arkansas.
