Information on the Internet

John Landgraf said, "Information technology and the internet are rapidly transforming almost every aspect of our lives – some for better, some for worse."

Whether you like the internet or hate it, there is no denying that huge amounts of information are readily available on it. In some cases it is information that may help you identify whom you need to talk to about a neighborhood issue. Listed below are some websites that provide information about your neighborhood.

Pagis.org is the Pulaski Area Geographical Information System. This site can show the ownership records of properties in Pulaski County. Go to pagis.org and click on "Online Mapping". Then Click on "Land Ownership Application". This should bring up a map of Pulaski County. In the left hand corner under Land Ownership is a box saying "Find address, street, or intersection". In that box put the address you are interested in. Hit the magnifying glass to start your search and it will list addresses for what you specified. In many cases it will list addresses in Little Rock and in North Little Rock. Look at the list and click on the address you are looking for with the North Little Rock zip code.

At this stage you should see a map with streets and house numbers and building outlines and the house you are searching for should have a box over it that is labeled "search result". If you click on the building, it will bring up a new box that is headed "Parcels". Sometimes this box will have the ownership information you are interested in. Sometimes there will be a triangle pointing to the right at the top of the box. If there is a triangle, you may click on that and it will take you to the ownership information. You will be able to see the Owner's Name and address. Sometimes at the bottom of the box you will see "More info" in the URL line. If you click on that, you may find information on the original platting of the property. Sometimes you will find information listed at the ARCountyData.com site that will list the owner, mailing address, parcel number, estimated values, and a history of past sales. There may also be a picture of the property and a general blueprint of the house's layout.

Arcountydata.com is another way to find information about property if you know the owner's name. Go to the site and you will see a box asking you "What Would You Like to Search?" You may choose real estate records, tax records, land records, or marriage licenses. Below the Welcome is a box to "Select a County". Scroll down and click on Pulaski County. This will bring up a page where you can do a basic search. Enter the owner's name and click on "Search" and it should list all the properties listed by that person. You may click on the "Parcel Number" and that will take you to information for that particular piece of property. It will provide you with the same information that is sometimes available on PAGIS.

If a corporation is listed as the owner of property, you can go to the **Arkansas Secretary of State's website at sos.arkansas.gov**. You can search under "Business Services" and "For Current Businesses". Click on "Business Entity Search". Type the business name into "Enter Either Name" box and hit search. This will bring up a list of all corporations in the state with that name. Click on the name you are interested in. This will bring up information on that corporation. You should be able to see the filing type, status, principal address, registered agent, agent address, and in some cases the officers of the corporation. If you want to see all the corporations managed by the registered agent, back out to the original search page and enter the name in the "Registered Agent" field. This should bring up other corporations, if there are any, that have the same person listed as the registered agent. If your search does not yield any results, try typing in a key word in the name instead of the whole exact name and that may give you the information you seek.


National Night Out 2021 - Update

North Little Rock residents can now recycle clean, clear, glass bottles and jars along with empty food and beverage gable top cartons.




Empty plastic bottles and jugs.

Empty aluminum, steel, and tin cans.

Paper, cardboard, newspapers, junk mail, and paperboard (*like cereal boxes, but without the plastic liner*). Flatten all cardboard to fit inside the cart.

It shall be unlawful for any person or entity to cause, permit, maintain or allow the creation or maintenance of a nuisance within the City of North Little Rock.

3.8.1 Infestation. All structures shall be kept free from insect and rodent infestation. All structures in which insects or rodents are found shall be promptly exterminated by approved processes that will not be injurious to human health. After extermination, proper precautions shall be taken to prevent reinfestation.

3.8.2 Owner. The owner of any structure shall be responsible for extermination within the structure prior to renting or leasing the structure.







GRAFFITI. Any inscription, word, figure, or design that is marked, etched, scratched, drawn, painted, pasted or otherwise affixed to or on any structural component of any building, structure, or other permanent facility regardless of the nature of the material of that structural component, or the nature of the inscription, to the extent that the same was not authorized in advance by the owner, or otherwise deemed to be a public nuisance.

Witt Stephens Jr Central Arkansas Nature Center—is a place that proves some of the best things in life are the hardest to find and often overlooked. Says Lauren Marshall, an education program specialist at the center.

It's strange to say something is overlooked in the middle of 2 major urban cities! The nature center is a very short trolley ride or a stroll across the Junction Bridge from the Maritime Museum and the bustling

Argenta Entertainment District to the River Market area. The Witt Stephens Jr Nature Center is tucked away on the south bank of the Arkansas River and behind the Museum of Discovery. It is a unique place which gives you a glimpse into The Natural State by surrounding you with native plants, watchable wildlife and nature virtually every step along the river.

The center tells the story of conservation in Arkansas and is free to the public. There are free educational programs open to the public on a weekly basis including: Little Wild Tales for small children and fish feeding every Wednesday, alligator feeding on Fridays and range day every 3rd Saturday of the month which instructs beginners how to safely shoot bb guns or archery. You can search out what's happening at the center by going to the Witt Stephens Jr Central Arkansas Nature



Center website or follow them on Facebook. The center has 3 educators that teach conservation, hunting, fishing and related subjects to churches, school groups, and any group that wants to learn more about conservation and wildlife in Arkansas.



"If I had a quarter every time a little boy put his face up next to the alligator tank or stared down a gar, I'd have a lot of quarters!"

says Marshall. It is not uncommon to see many types of birds and if you're lucky a ground hog at the bird

viewing area. The center has an alligator, snakes, turtles and a large aquarium with fish from all across the state. Whether it is hunting, fishing or watching wildlife, the nature center is the place to play, explore and connect.
