The City of North Little Rock welcomed our new Police Chief Hayward Finks during a public Swearing In Ceremony held on July 23, 2026 following the retirement of former Chief Patrick Thessing.



Finds spent decades in the Little Rock Police Department before a short term as assistant chief. He retired and joined the North Little Rock School District as Director of Safety Services.

During comments Chief Finks said "The door is always open for the community to be as transparent as possible with neighborhood groups and residents of the city." He added, "It is an honor and privilege to be given the distinction as the first black Chief of Police for the City of North Little Rock. I realize I stand on the shoulders of countless others in order to stand before." In his first 100 days in office, he will look at every aspect of the department to make changes as needed.

Pets and Mental Health

How can a pet help my mental health?

Caring for a pet can help our mental health in many ways, including:

- increasing your physical activity. Dog owners are likely to take their pets for a walk or run every day. This can be a fun way to fit exercise into your routine
- providing companionship. Pets can give you a sense of security and someone to share the day with. Caring for them can help you feel wanted and needed. This can be especially valuable for older people or those who live alone
- reducing anxiety. The companionship of a pet can help to ease your anxiety
- boosting self-confidence. Pets can be great listeners, offer unconditional love and won't criticize you. This can help your self-confidence, especially if you feel isolated or misunderstood
- helping you meet new people. Dog owners often stop and chat with each other on walks. But other pets can be a way to meet people too: in pet shops, training classes or online groups, for example
- adding structure to your day. Feeding, exercising and caring for a pet can help you keep to a daily routine, which can help you feel more grounded and focused. It can give your day purpose and a sense of achievement.

Pets may also help with specific conditions. For example, people with ADHD may benefit from the structure and routine that a pet needs. Managing their pet's responsibilities and keeping track of time – to feed or walk them on time, for example – may help them in other areas of their lives. Some people with ADHD are hyperactive – especially children – and playing with a pet can be a great way to release excess energy, whether that's walking

a dog or running around with a kitten.

Autistic people can benefit from having a pet. Pets provide the kind of unconditional relationship that can help someone build social skills and confidence. They can provide a sense of calm and reassurance if their owner feels over-

whelmed. Autistic children with sensory issues can involve their pets in sensory integration activities to help them get used to how something feels against their skin or how it smells or sounds.



Is having a pet right for me?

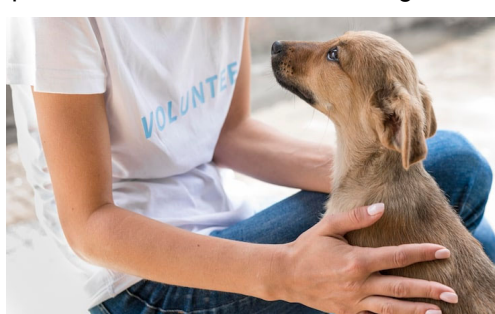
Having a pet is a serious commitment and not something to do on a whim. You'll need to have the time, money and energy for a pet, as well as a calm home environment with routine and consistency. Fostering a pet or helping a friend with theirs can help you see whether having your own is right for you. When you're ready to think about getting a pet, consider:

- how much outdoor space do you have
- how active you are
- how much time do you have to spend with your pet
- how much money do you have for vet's bills, insurance, food, toys, etc.? Some charities offer low-cost vet care, but they are limited to certain areas and have financial criteria

What if I can't have a pet?

If you can't afford a pet, live somewhere you're not allowed one, or you're worried about having times where you're too unwell to care for a pet, there are other options. The simplest option may be spending time with friends' pets, whether that's walking their dogs, stroking their cats or cuddling their guinea pigs. They might be glad to have someone to pet sit for them while they're on holiday. You can also consider signing up as a house-sitter: you look after someone's home, garden and pets in return for free accommodation.

Contact a rescue center or Animal Shelter near you to see what volunteering opportunities they may have. They may need volunteers to exercise, care for and socialize their pets. You could consider fostering an animal if you can



have a pet on a short-term basis but can't commit to one long-term. Some shy or scared animals need the peace and quiet of a home while waiting to be adopted.

To see a **list of issued permits**, visit the city website at nlr.ar.gov, then click City Departments and scroll down to City Clerk and Treasurer. Look for the dark box and click on Current Door to Door Peddlers.

To see an **individual ID/Permit**, click on the person's name. All licensed door-to-door peddlers are **required to have the ID issued by the City Clerk's Office with them at all times**.

****Currently, we one licensed permitted door to door solicitor in the city.**

All persons doing business **of any kind** within the city limits of North Little Rock are required to have a Business/Privilege License. This includes home-based such as lawn care or internet sales.

****If a business operates 1 day into the new year (2026), it is required to obtain a business license at the full fee.****

All 2025 NLR Business Licenses expired December 31, 2025. Renewal Invoices were mailed December 31 for the 2026 renewal.

Door-to-Door Sales (Solicitor/Peddler)

The City of North Little Rock requires all persons going door-to-door to sell a product or serve to obtain a permit. An applicant who wants to go door-to-door may obtain an application from the city through the North Little Rock City Clerk/Treasurer's Office, provide a current Arkansas State Police background check, a Surety Bond in the applicants name in the amount of \$1,000, a passport-size photo, \$6.00 administration fee and \$75.00 Permit/License fee. All permit applications are sent to the North Little Rock Police Chief, who reviews and either approves or denies a permit within five (5) business days. Issued permits are good for 90 days from the date of issue.

Any person found going door-to-door without the proper city issued photo identification issued the North Little Rock City Clerk will be subject to a citation and may be required to appear in court. If found guilty, the person will be subject to a fine and court costs. If a person fails to appear for the scheduled court date a Failure to Appear Warrant will be issued.

If someone comes to your door selling a product or service and is unable to produce a North Little Rock city-issued photo identification (see example left), between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Monday thru Friday, please call the City Clerk's Office at 501-975-8617. If it is after hours or on the weekend or holiday, please call the North Little Rock Police Department non-emergency number at 501-758-1234.

If a person comes to your door and you feel threatened please call 911. When making either call, please provide the address, description of the person, what they were wearing and type of vehicle if known.

Please note: the City of North Little Rock requires ALL persons doing business in the city to obtain a City Business/Privilege License. Any person/business operating without a license will be subject to a citation, as listed above. **Examples:** Food Trucks, brick-and-mortar establishments, door-to-door flyers, lawn care services, tree trimming, alarm sales, roofers, etc. If a person holds a **state issued license** of any kind (contractor, stylist, health inspection, daycare, etc.) a copy of the current state license is also required before a City Business/Privilege License will be issued.

Restaurants/Alcohol Sales: restaurants and those selling alcoholic beverages are required to present an annual health inspection. Restaurants and those businesses that sell alcohol are also required to hold a current City of North Little Rock Alcohol License. This license is in addition to the annual State issued Alcohol Beverage and Control (ABC) License.

Feel free to contact the North Little Rock City Clerk/Treasurer's Office any time with any questions!

Reminder: if you hire a tree service to trim or cut down a tree, they (tree company) should remove the debris.

If they (tree company) does NOT remove the debris, the city will assess the property owner a \$50.00 administration fee—plus the cost per cubic yard.

Reminder: make sure you hire a LICENSED and BONDED tree trimming company to work on your property. If they are not insured and someone is hurt, your property is damaged or city property is damaged your insurance may have to pay for the damages.

Together, we will continue to keep North Little Rock a great place to live, raise a family, work and play!

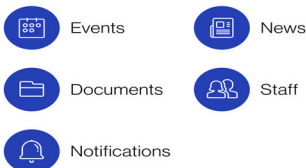

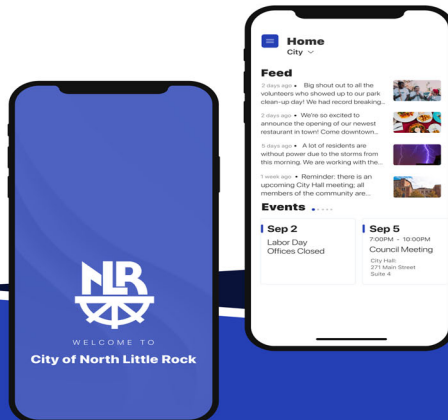
