Bid Specifications for Pole Mounted Capacitor Banks

1. Purpose

This bid specification is for pre-assembled, 600 kVAR and 900 kVAR pole-mounted, switched, grounded wye capacitors banks. The bid is for four banks of each size for a total of eight banks. Lead time and the capacitor bank manufacturer will be required.

Equipment to be included are capacitor units, vacuum switches, mounting rack, transformer, and junction box. Wiring and wildlife protection is noted in each equipment's requirements. Material and assembly shall be of the best quality, in compliance with standard manufacturing processes.

All specifications shall comply with the latest applicable industry standards unless stated otherwise in this specification. Exceptions to this specification or the industry standard must be explicitly requested to the contact on the bid cover. It is the responsibility of the bidder to submit data that fully meets these specifications and standards.

2. North Little Rock Electric System Information

- 4-wire, 3-phase grounded wye system.
- Primary voltage of 7960 V L-N, 13,800 V L-L.
- 60 Hz.

Equipment shall be reviewed to ensure proper delivery before removal from truck.

4. Capacitor Unit Requirements

- Capacitor units shall follow the IEEE 18-2012 standard and any other applicable standards.
- The 600 kVAR bank shall have three 200 kVAR capacitor units, one per phase.
- The 900 kVAR bank shall have three 300 kVAR capacitor units, one per phase.
- Units shall have two bushings, each rated for at least 95 kV BIL and creepage of at least 12 inches terminal to terminal.
- Units shall contain a non-PCB dielectric fluid and have non-PCB label on the outside of the unit.
- Units shall have a nameplate with standard data.

- Units shall be equipped with an internal discharge resistor designed to discharge the unit to 50 V in 5 minutes.
- Units shall be hermetically sealed.
- Wildlife protected wire connecting capacitor units' grounding terminals, with connection to mounting rack grounding connector. Wire to mounting rack ground can be bare copper.
- Wildlife terminal guard on both terminals of each unit.

5. Vacuum Switch Unit Requirements

- Each bank shall have three switches, one per phase.
- Switches shall have 120 VAC open/close control operation.
- Switches shall be rated for 200 A continuous.
- Switches shall be rated for 15 kV L-L.
- Switches shall be rated for at least 95 kV BIL and creepage of at least 16 inches terminal to terminal.
- Switches shall have 6-pin receptacle for control and status.
- Wildlife protected wire from the load side of each switch to capacitor unit primary terminal.
- Wildlife terminal guard on both terminals of each unit.
- Switch tanks shall be grounded to mounting rack.

6. Mounting Rack

- Rack shall be made of marine-grade structural aluminum.
- Rack shall have two-hole pole mounting plate with sway braces.
- Legs to allow the rack to sit on level ground with all equipment installed.
- Four lifting eyes.
- Rack shall allow capacitor units to be mounted side by side, in a line, all facing the same direction.
- Rack shall allow for six single phase capacitor units, with a vacant space between each unit.
- Capacitor unit mountings must be able to accommodate different size ANSI and NEMA standard kVAR units in the same space.
- At least two grounding connectors, one on the pole-mounting side and one on the side opposite
 of the pole-mounting side.
- Mountings for three oil switches on side opposite of the pole-mounting side.
- Mounting for oil filled transformer on side perpendicular to pole-mounting side.
- Mounting for junction box on pole-mounting side.

7. Transformer

- Each bank shall have one transformer mounted on the frame.
- 1 kVA preferred.
- One primary bushing, 7960 V.
- One secondary bushing, 120 V.
- At least 95 kV BIL rating.
- Internal overcurrent fuse or other method of protection.
- Wildlife terminal guard on primary bushing.
- Transformer tank grounded to mounting rack.

8. Junction Box

High impact PVC, weather and UV resistant.

- Hinged cover.
- Cable gland type hardware entrances.
- Terminals for Open/Close status, Open/Close commands, and 120 VAC power.
- Terminals labeled.
- Terminals accept copper or aluminum conductors.
- Open/Close status and commands prewired from vacuum switches to junction box.
- Power prewired from transformer to junction box.
- At least 25 feet of 6-conductor control cable prewired at junction box for controller.

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR THE CITY OF NORTH LITTLE ROCK, AR

- 1. When submitting an "Invitation to Bid," the bidder warrants that the commodities covered by the bid shall be free from defects in material and workmanship under normal use and service. In addition, bidder must deliver new commodities of the latest design and model, unless otherwise specified in the "Invitation to Bid."
- 2. Prices quoted are to be net process, and when an error is made in extending total prices, the City may accept the bid for the lesser amount whether reflected by extension or by the correct multiple of the unit price.
- 3. Discounts offered will be taken when the City qualifies for such. The beginning date for computing discounts will be the date of invoice or the date of delivery and acceptance, whichever is later.
- 4. When bidding other than the brand and/or model specified in the "Invitation to Bid," the brand and/or model number must be stated by that item in the "Invitation to Bid," and descriptive literature be submitted with the bid.
- 5. The City reserves the right to reject any and all bids.
- 6. The Purchasing office reserves the right to award items, all or none, or by line item(s).
- 7. Quality, time and probability of performance may be factors in making an award.
- 8. Bid quotes submitted will remain firm for 30 calendar days from bid opening date; however, the prices may remain firm for a longer period of time if mutually agreeable between bidder and the Department of Commerce.
- 9. Bidder must submit a completed signed copy of the front page of the "Invitation to Bid" and must submit any other information required in the "Invitation to Bid."
- 10. In the event a contract is entered into pursuant to the "Invitation to Bid," the bidder shall not discriminate against any qualified employee or qualified applicant for employment because of race, sex, color, creed, national origin or ancestry. The bidder must include in any and all subcontracts a provision similar to the above.
- 11. Sales or use tax is not to be included in the bid price, but is to be added by the vendor to the invoice billing to the City. Although use tax is not to be included in this bid, vendors are to register and pay tax direct to the Arkansas State Revenue Department.
- 12. Prices quoted shall be "Free on Board" (F.O.B.) to destination at designated facility in North Little Rock. Charges may not be added after the bid is opened.
- 13. In the event of two or more identical low bids, the contract may be awarded arbitrarily or for any reason to any of such bidders or split in any proportion between them at the discretion of the Department of Commerce..
- 14. Specifications furnished with this Invitation are intended to establish a desired quality or performance level, or other minimum dimensions and capacities, which will provide the best product available at the lowest possible price. Other than designated brands and/or models approved as equal to designated products shall receive an equal consideration.
- 15. Samples of items when required, must be furnished free, and, if not called for within 30 days from date of bid opening, will become property of the City.
- 16. Bids will not be considered if they are:
 - 1. Submitted after the bid's opening time.
 - 2. Submitted electronically or faxed (unless authorized by Purchasing Agent).
- 17. Guarantees and warranties should be submitted with the bid, as they may be a consideration in making an award.

18. **CONSTRUCTION**

- A. Contractor is to supply the City with evidence of having and maintaining proper and complete insurance, specifically Workman's Compensation Insurance in accordance with the laws of the State of Arkansas, Public Liability and Property Damage. All premiums and cost shall be paid by the Contractor. In no way will the City be responsible in case of accident.
- B. When noted, a Certified check or bid bond in the amount of 5% of total bid shall accompany bid.
- C. A Performance Bond equaling the total amount of any bid exceeding \$35,000.00 must be provided for any contract for the repair, alteration or erection of any public building, public structure or public improvement (pursuant to Arkansas Code Annotated Section 22-9-203).
- 19. **LIQUIDATED DAMAGES** Liquidated damages shall be assessed beginning on the first day following the maximum delivery or completion time entered on this bid form and/or provided for by the plans and specifications.
- 20. **AMBIGUITY IN BID** Any ambiguity in any bid as the result of omission, error, lack of clarity or non-compliance by the bidder with specifications, instructions, and all conditions of bidding shall be construed in the light most favorable to the City.
- 21. The bid number should be stated on the face of the sealed bid envelope. If it is not, the envelope will have to be opened to identify.
- Whenever a bid is sought seeking a source of supply for a specified period of time for materials and services, the quantities of usage shown are estimated ONLY. No guarantee or warranty is given or implied by the participants as to the total amount that may or may not be purchased from any resulting contracts.
