The Importance Of Neighborhood Organizations In A Neighborhood

Over the years numerous articles have been published regarding how important crime watch/neighborhood organizations are to neighborhoods. Crime is no longer confined to larger cities or specific neighborhoods. It's everywhere. The original neighborhood crime watch concept was developed to be an extension of the local police department providing additional "eyes and ears" in the community.

Through time, many North Little Rock neighborhoods have seen success in changing the direction of the neighborhood. Back in the 90's we saw neighborhoods exploding, making changes to improve their neighborhoods. We saw:

- A proposed overpass was too costly for one neighborhood. It was going to split the neighborhood in two. In spite of the fact it would cost nothing to the city to build, the neighborhood managed to get the overpass removed from the master street plan, preserving the neighborhood.
- Another neighborhood adopted a land use plan that changed the locations of apartments and businesses. This was the first time a neighborhood organization had proposed their own land use plan that the city adopted.
- One small neighborhood took on task an environmental pollution issue and succeeded.
- It was the neighborhood groups that made not only the suggestions for use, but offered support for the last sales tax that was passed.
- North Little Rock neighborhood organizations fought for and got the juvenile curfew, police substations, pedestrian and outdoor storage legislation passed and much more.

It has become evident that neighborhoods that have an active organization, have fewer problems. Does the crime go completely away? No! Crime does have a tendency to migrate to an area that doesn't have an active organization. Does your neighborhood have an active organization? Do you support your neighborhood organization by attending meetings and being involved?
