





Recovery Update 36 – Arkansas Severe Storms and Tornadoes

This is the FINAL Recovery Update.

September 13, 2023, DR-4698/Recovery Update 36

Key Messages

- As of September 13, 3,591 applicants have been approved for disaster assistance through FEMA's Individual Assistance (IA) Program. FEMA has approved more than \$9.4 million to help Arkansas residents in Cross, Lonoke and Pulaski counties recover from the severe storms and tornadoes that occurred March 31.
- The deadline to apply for FEMA assistance was Monday, July 3.

Direct Housing

On April 26, FEMA approved Direct Housing Assistance in the forms of Direct Lease and Transportable Temporary Housing Units (TTHUs) for eligible survivors in **Cross County.**

- As of September 13, 43 households have been approved for a temporary unit.
 - o To date, **43** households have been licensed in.
 - 2 households have moved out of their units.

Public Assistance

- Public Assistance received 35 Requests for Public Assistance (RPAs).
- As of September 13, 45 projects have been obligated for more than \$8.1 million.
- The 100% Cost Share ended May 10. The deadline to apply for PA was June 2.

Small Business Administration

- As of September 13, SBA has approved 372 loans approved for more than \$23.2 million.

Major Disaster Declaration (April 2, 2023)

- Three Arkansas counties were designated for FEMA Individual Assistance: Cross, Lonoke and Pulaski.
- Cross, Lonoke and Pulaski Counties are also designated for debris removal and emergency protective measures (Categories A and B) including direct federal assistance, under the Public Assistance program.
- On April 13, the Major Disaster Declaration for the State of Arkansas (FEMA-4698-DR-AR) was amended.
 - o Cross, Lonoke and Pulaski Counties were approved for FEMA's Public Assistance Categories of work C-G.
- On Saturday, April 8, the Major Disaster Declaration for Arkansas was amended.
 - Federal funds for debris removal and emergency protective measures, including direct federal assistance, have been increased to 100 percent of the total eligible costs for a continuous 30-day period April 10 to May 10, 2023.
- On April 24, Cross County was approved for the Direct Temporary Housing Program.
- All 75 Arkansas counties are approved for FEMA Hazard Mitigation Assistance.
