Bulky and Green Waste Curbside Pickup Regulations for the City of North Little Rock

NOTICE! Due to Regulations by the Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ), the City of North Little Rock can no longer deliver co-mingled (mixed) yard waste/bulky item loads to the Composting Facility. Therefore, Green Waste and Bulky Waste must be

separated at the curb into two (2) piles as illustrated on the other side of this card:

GREEN WASTE — Includes bagged grass clippings, bagged leaves, bagged pine needles, shrubbery, hedges, plants (without pots), limbs, unpainted/unfinished wooden furniture and/or boards. Note: Tree limbs placed on the curb must not be greater than 6 inches in diameter by 12 feet in length, OR 12 inches wide by 6 feet long. (As required by Chapter 13 of the NLR City Code, Ordinance #8585)





BULKY WASTE – Which includes items that are too large and bulky/ heavy for regular garbage collections. In particular, couches, mattresses, minor amounts of carpet, finished/painted furniture, minor amounts of remodeling materials, rubbish and appliances (must have compressors and/or Freon removed). Note: Rubbish, trash and appliances may not be placed at the curb for collection earlier than one day prior to the scheduled curbside pickup. Bulky waste pickup is the next business day after regular garbage pickup.

BULKY WASTE



REMINDERS!! As required by the NLR Municipal Code, Chapter 13, Solid Waste Ordinance #8585, Adopted 11-11-13.

- Tree Service Contractors are responsible for the removal and proper disposal of all debris generated by their contracted work activities.
- Disposal of new construction debris, demolition debris and tree clearing activities (such as logs, stumps and root balls) are strictly the responsibility of the property/lot owners.
- Green and/or Bulky Waste shall not be placed in the Public Streets or sidewalks in such a manner as to obstruct or interfere with vehicular or pedestrian traffic.
- Large cardboard boxes and Styrofoam should be placed out on the curb with regular household garbage collections. Otherwise, recycle all cardboard and paper via Waste Management, Inc.'s green and yellow recycling containers.
- Items that we will not collect: Dirt, Rock, Concrete Products, Liquid Paint (must be dried or mixed with absorbent), Bulk Chemicals, Bulk Oil, Ammunition, Burnt Waste, Large Amounts of Insulation and Roofing Materials, Lawnmowers with Engines, Creosote Cross Ties, and Human/Animal Waste.

Turn left when you enter the building and on your left you will see an area where you can drop off your prescription medication. It is much safer to get rid of old medicine than to keep it in your house. It is also better for the environment

if the medicine is disposed of at the police department instead of with your garbage or down your toilet.
