


Take Your Stuff. Lock Your Car.

The most prevalent crime in North Little Rock is breaking and entering. B&E refers to getting into someone's car or shed (as opposed to burglary, which refers to breaking into a residence). Every month at every neighborhood meeting police officers cite statistics listing B&Es that occurred the previous month. Every neighborhood in every part of the city experiences some B&Es during the course of a year. The police advice is always the same – take your stuff and lock your car.



When B&Es occur in one of our neighborhoods, the usual pattern is that a

thief or thieves will move down a street trying every car door on the street and pilfering though any vehicle left unlocked. Locked vehicles are passed by unless there is something in view that is worth the risk of making noise by breaking a window.....a laptop, a phone, a purse, a wallet, a handgun. If the car is locked and there is nothing of value visible, it makes no sense for a thief to break a window and risk alerting residents.

B&Es at nonresidential locations are more likely to involve breaking a window to gain entrance into a locked vehicle. Malls, shopping centers, daycares, fitness centers, trails, anyplace where people will leave their vehicles for an extended period of time are places that may see thieves conducting their business. Unlocked vehicles at these public locations will be pilfered through, and locked vehicles will have a window broken when the thief sees something worth stealing. Again, a locked vehicle with nothing visible is not worth the trouble to break into.

So, what to do to make your neighborhood safer? Take your valuables with you when you leave your car (even in your driveway) or put them out of sight, and lock your vehicle. When you are leaving your car out in public, again take your valuables with you or put them out of sight and lock your vehicle. Shopping? Put your bags in the trunk and lock your vehicle.

Some people will say you should be able to leave your vehicles unlocked with your property in the car in plain sight. Yes, you should, but you risk losing your stuff and marking your neighborhood as a high value target for thieves when you do that. It is less a case of us blaming the victim and more a case of asking people to be responsible with their property while making our neighborhoods safer. You would not leave your lawnmower sitting in your front yard from week to week because you know the police cannot be everywhere and your mower might end up going home with someone else. Use that same common sense to protect your car, your property, and your neighborhood. If everyone on your street locked their cars every night, it wouldn't take long for a thief to move to greener pastures and target a street or neighborhood or city that was less protected.

Please bring your driver's license. Our staff may be able to copy or scan your driver's license to get your name, age, and address. This speeds up the data entry process which means less time at the clinic for you and shorter lines!
