Disaster Preparedness Car Kit Edition

If a disaster strikes while you are away from home, how will you cope? If roads are blocked and you cannot drive, what might you need to see you back to your home? What supplies should you carry in your car?

FEMA suggests that you create a kit that you keep in your car. It does not have to take up a great deal of room, but having it might just make the difference in your safety.

Suggested items include: Dust masks, gloves, water, flashlights with extra batteries, rain gear, hat, sunglasses, blanket, tool kit, sunscreen, some nonperishable snacks, charger for phone/tablet, first aid kit, and jumper cables.

Does Your Group NALC?

There are more than twenty-five active neighborhood associations, community development corporations, crime watches, and property owners associations in North Little Rock. Since you are getting this newsletter you are probably familiar with at least one group in your neighborhood. These groups hold regular meetings and discuss neighborhood issues.

Did you know there is also a group made up of representatives of those neighborhood associations? We have the Neighborhood Associations Leadership Council (NALC) made up of representatives of our neighborhood groups. Each president of a neighborhood association, c.d.c., crime watch or p.o.a. is welcome to come, or they can appoint a representative from their group. NALC meets once a month in the Neighborhood Services office.

Besides giving group leaders the opportunity to meet with other neighborhood associations, meetings include guest speakers talking about city departments/policies and group organizing ideas. NALC's main purpose is to look at issues that affect neighborhoods city-wide and offer ideas and solutions for those issues. NALC also serves as a sounding board where groups can solicit support if there is a particular problem in a neighborhood that would benefit from wider exposure and broader support from other groups. Mayor Smith is very interested in NALC and in having a council that can give feedback on city issues, city policies, and city performance.

Is your group represented at NALC? If not, why not? Every neighborhood group should have a seat at this important table. Talk to your group leadership about this opportunity.

City Department Spotlight – NLR Animal Shelter

The North Little Rock Animal Shelter has two sections: Animal Control and the Animal Shelter.

Working to ensure the health and welfare of both residents and animals in the city, this department works to prevent potentially dangerous wildlife-human interactions. Animal Control responds to an average of 850 calls per month, for everything from testing bats for rabies to removing road kill from city streets. They notify neighborhood residents when a rabid animal has been found in the area. Stray animals running loose are picked up and brought to the Animal Shelter.

The Shelter part of the department adopts out an average of 900 pets each year, finding homes all across the country for adoptable animals through partnerships with animal rescue groups. The goal is a city free of feral and unwanted stray animals through intense spay/neuter programs and enforcement of the dog licensing ordinance. North Little Rock Animal Shelter accepts animals from Pulaski County.

Dogs and cats that you own are required to have an annual rabies vaccination through a licensed veterinarian. Animals also must have a yearly city license. Licenses for sterilized pets cost \$5.00 annually, while unsterilized pets cost \$30.00 per year for a license.


